

Although we didn't dress up this year, that certainly didn't stop us having great fun on this year's World Book Day last Thursday... The children took part in lots of activities that were designed to encourage a love of books and reading:

- **★ Take One Book** each class spent the day reading books with no (or very few) words! These books were beautiful picture books written to ignite children's imaginations and from the work we've seen, they certainly did just that.
- ★ Drop Everything and Read (DEAR) at two points during the day, a bell rang and the children had to stop everything they were doing, grab a reading book and read for 10 mins.
- ★ Paired Reading older pupils spent time reading with younger pupils. They all really enjoyed this and it is something that we will be doing more of in the future as it has HUGE benefits for both the younger and older child.
- ★ **Big Book Swap Shop** The response to this was amazing with so many children bringing books to swap and some children even donating extra books so more children could have a new book to take home.
