



PE and Sport Premium Funding – 2016-2017

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school Headteachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. During the year 2016-2017, Barnard Grove Primary School will receive £8,653 PE and Sport Premium Funding, allocated in the following way:

Skipping event and coaching	£500	Our Year 2 and 4 children were all provided top quality skipping coaching over a period of weeks.
