



PE and Sport Premium Funding – 2017-2018

The Government in England has provided additional funding of over £150 million per annum since 2013/14 to improve PE and school sport in primary schools. From September 2017, the funding will be doubled to enable primary schools to make further improvements to the quality and breadth of the PE and sport they offer. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

During the year 2017-2018, Barnard Grove Primary School will receive £14,845 PE and Sport Premium Funding, allocated in the following way:

Specialist P.E. Teacher	£7,000 (part-fund of annual salary)	The school has a specialist P.E. teacher that delivers PE in Key Stage 1 and 2. Lessons are taught alongside the class teachers and the assistant sports coach.	All pupils in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 receive high-quality PE lessons throughout the academic year, raising the profile of the subject. School staff, working alongside the Sports Teacher, are up- skilled and are more confident in their delivery of PE lessons. School sports teams are better prepared, when taking part in representative events, raising their aspirations and self-confidence.
Assistant Sports Coach	£4600 (part-fund of annual salary)	The school have an assistant sports coach who aids the PE Teacher in delivering national curriculum lessons, provides lunchtime activities also extra-curricular clubs. The assistant sports coach also receives additional payment for taking children to sports events.	Every pupil is provided with the opportunity to attend an extra-curricular lunchtime sports clubs. Increased participation in sporting activities, as SEND, less active and gifted pupils are targeted to attend clubs. Additional time is spent working with school teams, focusing on improved performance, raising the confidence of pupils, as well as the school profile in the community.
Tennis coach	£80	A tennis coach has come into the school to provide high quality coaching to our Year 3 children. This will better prepare them for the tennis event.	Children receive a high-quality coaching experience; this raises the profile of tennis within the school. School sports teams are better prepared, when taking part in representative events, raising their aspirations and self-confidence.
Swimming Gala	£25	Children were entered into a Town Swimming Gala.	Children can utilise the skills learnt throughout the academic year whilst in swimming lessons to represent Barnard Grove. Have a competition to work towards encourages more children to take up swimming. Also, it increases



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			interest around school.
Skipping event and coaching	£500	Our Year 2 and 4 children were all provided top quality skipping coaching over a period of weeks. Thirty children from each year group were then selected to represent the school in a skipping festival.	<p>This raised the profile of skipping within the school and children practiced their newly learnt skills during break and lunchtimes.</p> <p>Children are now practicing skipping on a daily basis during every lunch time. This is raising children's fitness levels within the school.</p>
Membership of Hartlepool Primary Schools' FA	£75	By becoming a member of Hartlepool Primary Schools' FA children from all years in Key Stage 2 have been able to compete in inter-school competition.	<p style="text-align: center;">Increase the number of pupils taking part in inter-school competition.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Increase KS2 children's interest in football throughout the school.</p>
Specialist P.E. Equipment	£600	The equipment purchased will be used in order to improve learners experience in physical education lessons and in extra-curricular clubs.	<p>Due to an increased interest in football within the school, a new set of a goalposts were required in order to host boys and girls football afterschool clubs on the same evening. These will also be used in lessons and during break times.</p> <p>Indoor Athletics equipment was purchased in order for children to use in lessons, after school clubs and also during break times. This raised the profile of Indoor Athletics within the school and also encouraged a number of children to attend a local athletics club's sessions.</p>
Contribution towards the Cluster PE and School Sport Co-ordinator (SSCO) Role	£1,500	The SSCO works closely with the school's Sports Teacher in the planning and delivery of high-quality inter-school competitions, in a range of sports.	<p>Inter-school competitions lead to town-wide and Tees Valley representation for successful pupils.</p> <p>Events provide pupils with the chance to enhance their skills, both sporting and socially. This is particularly beneficial for Year 6 pupils, prior to them starting secondary education.</p>
Staff kit	£300	Sports kit was purchased for the school PE	Having matching kit for the school's PE staff improves the schools identify at different sporting events.



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		Teacher and Assistant Sports Coach.	It also makes the staff easy to identify for the children whilst at different sporting events.
HUFC Half-time Penalty Competition	£20	Children entered HUFC's Half-time Penalty Competition.	<p>Entering this competition has allowed children to participate against other schools in a penalty competition at half time during HUFC games.</p> <p>Children also get complimentary tickets to the fixture allowing them to watch their local team.</p> <p>Being part of this competition allows children to build confidence and self-belief as they are taking their penalties in front of a large crowd.</p>
Additional Year 6 Swimming Lessons	£128	Children who weren't as confident at swimming were given extra lessons to aid them in passing their 25m requirement.	<p>Less confident children had extra lessons to build their confidence in the swimming pool. This allowed them to pass their 25m swim that is a requirement for their school curriculum.</p> <p>Building these skills for less confident swimmers is essential for them when moving to secondary school.</p>
